Date Theme Scriptures to Read/Questions for Reflection

*Each week's focus—read these verses aloud, 3 times if possible. Ask yourself: What word or phrase jumps out? What do you see/hear? What is God saying to you?

September 7 The Holy Spirit and Early Church Read Acts 2, Focus:* 2:37-47

- 1. Read Acts 1:8—Why is this story happening?
- 2. What strikes you about the Pentecost story (2:1-15)?
- 3. What stands out in Peter's sermon (2:14-36)? What instructions did he give?
- 4. The Holy Spirit gave Peter and others the boldness to speak--What gifts have you received from God? How do you use them to help others?
- 5. What were the main components of the early church's life together (2:43-47)? How do these apply to us today in the church?
- 6. How has your faith grown through the church community?

Sept. 14 Witnesses Read Acts 3-4, Focus:*Acts 3:1-16

- 1. Who helped you understand the gospel and how?
- 2. What is happening in this passage?
- 3. What were Peter and John able to give the crippled man? What doors did this open for him, and for them?
- 4. Why is Peter's explanation of the healing significant? What does this mean for us today?
- 5. What do we learn from Peter's example? How are you a witness for Christ?
- 6. What excuses do we use for keeping our faith quiet? In what ways can we share the good news?

Sept. 21 Tested Read Acts 5, Focus: *Acts 5:17-33

- 1. Who do you know who has stood up for what's right and what made them so courageous?
- 2. What is the situation between the religious leaders and the apostles? What accusations were hurled against the apostles?
- 3. Why does Peter say they must continue their ministry?
- 4. How do you seek to follow God's authority, over human authority?
- 5. What can we learn from the apostles about criticism and unfair treatment in our lives?
- 6. What is some of the opposition we face to our faith today?

Sept. 28 Following the Spirit Read Acts 8, Focus: *Acts 8:26-40

- 1. Think of a time you felt compelled by God to help someone—what did you do?
- 2. What is significant about the person Philip helps?
- 3. What is the result of Philip's obedience?
- 4. How do we pay attention to the Holy Spirit's leading today? How do we recognize the Spirit's voice?
- 5. What holds us back from obedience? What is the danger in ignoring the Spirit?
- 6. What is the Holy Spirit leading you to do in your life today?

Oct 5 Conversion Read Acts 9, Focus: *Acts 9:3-20

- 1. When have you seen God change someone's life?
- 2. Who is Saul and how does God convert him? Does he apologize for his former life? Why is that significant?
- 3. What do we learn from the obedience of Ananias?
- 4. What is the power of Saul's conversion for us today? What do we learn about God, and people?
- 5. How has God used you to minister to someone else, or to share the good news?
- 6. What is your own conversion story? (or a story of God at work in your life?)

Oct 12 Unity Read Acts 10, Focus: *Acts 10:24-35

- 1. How were Peter and Cornelius brought together?
- 2. What lesson did God give Peter and how? How does this apply to us today?
- 3. What differences divide Christians today?
- 4. Which issues are worth fighting over, and which ones are not? How can we stay together even when we disagree?
- 5. How can we build a sense of unity in the church? What does our unity say to the world around us?
- 6. What has been most impactful in our study of Acts?
